	Singular	Plural	
-s	cat horse	cats horses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Singular means 'one.' Plural means 'two or more.' To make most nouns plural, add -s.
-es	watch dish bus box	watches dishes buses boxes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Noun ending: -ch, -sh, -s, -x Plural form: Add -es.
-ies	baby pony	babies ponies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Noun ending: a consonant + y Plural form: Change y to i and add -es.
Irregular	child man foot	children men feet	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> No rules More examples: sheep - sheep tooth - teeth woman - women






