## Grammar Introduction

### A Singular and Plural Nouns

	Singular	Plural	
-s	house tree	houses trees	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Singular means 'one.' Plural means 'two or more.'</li> <li>To make most nouns plural, add -s.</li> </ul>
-es	beach brush glass fox	beaches brushes glasses foxes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Noun ending: -ch, -sh, -s, -x</li> <li>Plural form: Add -es.</li> </ul>
-ies	family story	families stories	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Noun ending: a consonant + -y</li> <li>Plural form: Change y to i and add -es.</li> </ul>
-ves	leaf knife	leaves knives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Noun ending: -f or -fe</li> <li>Plural form: Change f or fe to v and add -es.</li> </ul>
Irregular	mouse sheep woman	mice sheep women	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>No rules</li> <li>More examples: child - children    foot - feet    man - men</li> </ul>

	Singular	Plural	
Count Noun	a family a leaf one mouse	three families five leaves seven mice	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Count nouns can be counted with numbers. They have singular and plural forms.</li> </ul>
Non-Count Noun	homework meat paper	-	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Non-count nouns cannot be counted with numbers. They have singular forms only.</li> <li>Do not use <b>a</b> or <b>an</b> with non-count nouns.</li> <li>More examples: money, rain, rice, snow, water</li> </ul>
