Wonderful Theater

Do you like going to the theater? The theater is a place to see live performances, like plays, operas, or musicals. In theater, the actors perform on a stage. They act, sing, or dance in front of a live audience. That's why it's so exciting to watch them.

Orchestra Pit

An orchestra is a special band that plays music at an opera or a musical. The musicians in the orchestra sit in a lowered area in front of the stage. It's called an "orchestra pit." The audience usually can't see the musicians when they are playing!

Plays, operas, and musicals: How are they different?



A **play** is similar to a movie. But in a play, the actors perform on a stage, not on a screen. So watching a play is like watching a real-life movie.



An **opera** is a play with music. In an opera, the singers tell a story through beautiful songs.



A **musical** is very similar to an opera. The only difference is the music. Classical music is used in an opera, but popular music is used in a musical.
