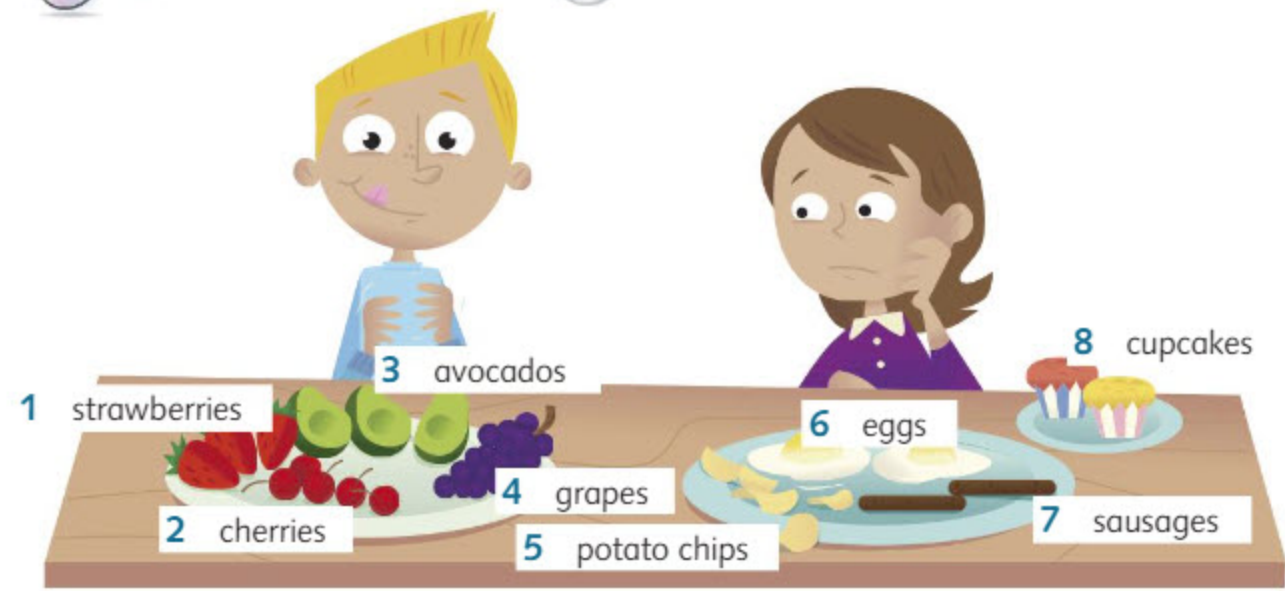

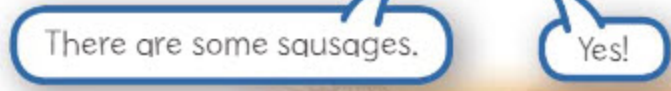

Big Breakfast

Many children all over the world have cereal, toast, and eggs for breakfast. But in South Africa, if you go to an ostrich farm, there are omelets on the breakfast menu – very big omelets made from ostrich eggs! Ostrich eggs taste the same as chicken eggs, but they have very hard shells. You can jump on an ostrich egg, and it won't break!
